Stephanie was committed to helping those in our community who are underserved. She volunteered with organizations, including KaBoom!, the United Way, the Boston Living Center, Rosie's Place, and the Goodwill Good Guides program. In 2012 Stephanie became a board member of ACE. Her deep commitment to the advancement of marginalized young
